Data Context Notes:

- For February 2018, CMS is reporting growth of 16,327,895 compared to July-September 2013. This figure is less than the 16,398,949 in net enrollment growth that was included in the Medicaid and CHIP: January 2018 Applications, Eligibility Determinations, and Enrollment Report by over 71,000. This difference does not match the 72,831 decrease in the full report for the January to February 2018 period because the 72,831 figure is based on 51 states, while the 71,000 figure is based on only 49 states.
